

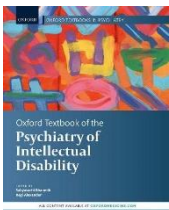

Oxford Textbook of the Psychiatry of Intellectual Disability

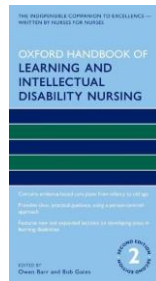

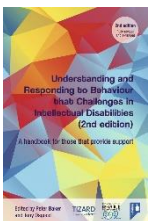

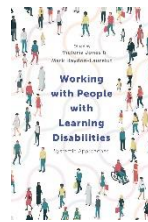

intellectual disabilities. It is split into four sections, each representing a crucial step in understanding behaviour that challenges.

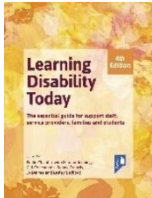
Working with people with learning disabilities : systemic approaches

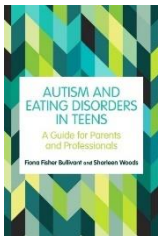
Challenging behaviour: a handbook

a year-long inquiry, Myers highlights the autobiographical works of the students through writing, photography, poetry, art, and more.

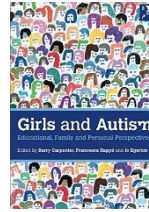

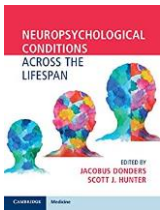

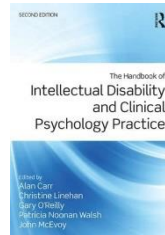
