(1936) (Watt/Wright) (GPO Film Unit) 24 mins B/W

One of the seminal films of the British Documentary Movement; "Night Mail" is a tribute to the railway and postal employees working as a team. The film observes the workers as they tirelessly toil through the night collecting and sorting the royal mail as the train progresses through England to Scotland. Words by poet WH Auden and music from Benjamin Britten complement the realist aesthetic and provide a sense of Britishness.

Cyclists Special

Featuring a group of cyclists from Willesden and Watford, "Cyclists Special" promotes the special excursion service from Watford Junction to Rugby.

As the train arrives at Rugby (Midland) Station, the main group split up into Three separate small groups and venture off to explore; Warwickshire, Leicestershire and Northamptonshire. The film records the tranquillity of the locations and the enjoyment experienced by the cyclists as they take a day out in the countryside.
