#### Group Activity/engagement in forensic services

The library services conducted literature searches on the following topics:

- Group Activity/engagement in forensic services
- Benefits of therapeutic communities in secure hospitals
- Training and 'shaping' staff teams in forensic secure services



The literature obtained is aiding me in the development of evidenced based group interventions, which will be delivered in the men's forensic inpatient service.

We are also looking at setting up a therapeutic environment on one of the low secure units in the men's service and the literature has been invaluable in supporting this development.

Follow-up on impact - group sessions had been developed using information from the articles and these had been implemented in practice. The sessions had worked well and have had a positive impact on the participants.
